Accomplishments

TENURED FACULTY: Completed the tenure process in 2010.

DOCTORATE: My dissertation, *Behind the Doors of White Supremacy*, has been downloaded from the University of Denver over 11,000 times and is referenced by members of the NSA and the FBI. I contributed to the nationwide discussion of American white supremacy.

FACULTY SENATE PRESIDENT: this is an elected position and requires excellent communication, crisis management, decision making, integrity, and ethics.

UNGRADING: shifted all courses to skills based learning with no points or percentages. Assignments created to encourage exploration, risk taking, and iterative improvement. The results: about a 10% improvement in course grades.

INSTRUCTIONAL COACH: served as peer support to over 200 faculty and instructors. I also coached during COVID: I worked with colleagues to design robust professional support for the transition to real-time remote and online learning. I delivered 17 unique workshops, observed more than 30 classes, and conducted over 200 one-on-one appointments with educators, all geared toward improving the classroom experience. Over 98% of coachees reported "high" satisfaction with the coaching experience and 100% reported overall satisfaction.

SFAC REPRESENTATIVE: Front Range Community College elects their representative. My colleagues trust me to represent them.

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE TO THE STATE BOARD: SFAC elected me to represent all faculty in the state on the Board.

EQUITY AND INCLUSION: designed and co-facilitated the Equity Academy for Instruction, a semester long intensive learning experience for faculty and instructors. Almost 200 faculty and instructors have completed the Academy; we are working now to identify impact on student success.

FULBRIGHT SCHOLAR: I participated in a Fulbright GPA in 2015, traveling to Morocco to study indigenous folk tales. I updated curriculum in WST 2400 and PHI 1014 as a result.

CENTER FOR TEACHING AND LEARNING: I am entrusted with building new CTL for Front Range Community College. In addition to supervising coordinators and program facilitators, I oversee a \$300,000 budget, including grant funding. We are developing the strategic plan now that will maximize efficiency and ensure that all faculty and instructors have access to outstanding professional learning opportunities.

REPRESENTATIVE TO STATE FACULTY ADVISORY COUNCIL: Front Range elects our representatives. My selection is an indication of the trust I have from my colleagues.

FACULTY REPRESENTATIVE TO THE STATE BOARD OF COMMUNITY COLLEGES AND OCCUPATIONAL EDUCATION: I was selected by SFAC to serve in this role, again indicating the confidence my colleagues have in me.
